CLIMATE

The climate of the district is characterised by a hot dry summer and a bracing winter. The year may be divided into four seasons. The cold season from about the middle of November to February is followed by the summer season lasting till about the end of June. The period from about the end of June to the end of September constitutes the south-west monsoon season. The succeeding period up to the middle of Novembar is the post-monsoon or pre-winter.

Records of rainfall in the district are available for only three stations for periods exceeding 90 years. A statement of the rainfall at these stations and for the district as a whole is given in Table II. The avorage annual or normal rainfall in the district is 940.3 mm. The rainfall in the district is comparatively more around Lucknow than elsewhere. About 88 per cent of the annual rainfall in the district is received during the south-west monsoon months, June to September, July being the rainiest month. The variation in the rainfall from year to year is large. In the fifty-year period, from 1901 to 1950, the highest annual rainfall amounting to 193 per cent of the normal accurred in 1915. The lowest annual rainfall, which was only 44 por cent of the normal, was recorded in 1907. The annual rainfall in the district in the fifty-year period was less than 80 per cent of the normal in 13 years, two of them being consecutive. Considering the annual rainfall at the individual stations, two consecutive years of such low rainfall occurred thrice at Mohanlalganj and twice at Lucknow and Malihabad. The annual rainfall in the district was between 700 mm. and 1200 mm. in 33 years out of 50.

On an average there are 46 rainy days (i.e. days with rainfall of 2.5 mm. or more) in a year in the district. This number varies from 44 at Malihabad to 49 at Lucknow.

The heaviest rainfall in 24 hours recorded at any station in the district was 324.6 mm. at Malihabad on September 1, 1915.

Temperature

There are two motoorological observatories, one in Lucknow city and the other at Amausi airport. Statements regarding temperature at these stations are given in Table III and III(a). The records of the city observatory which are available for a long period may be taken as representative of the climatic conditions in the district in general. After February the temperature increases rapidly till May which is generally the hottest month. The average daily maximum temperature in May is 41.2°C. and the average daily minimum 26.5° C. The weather is intensely hot in summer with the maximum temperature on individual days sometimes going over 47°C. Hot dust-laden westerly winds, locally known as 'loo', blow during the summer afternoons and these add to discomfort. However, the occasional thunder-storms cool the air a little, though only temporarily. With the advance of the south west monsoon into the district after the middle of June, there is appreciable drop in the day temperatures. The nights are, however, as warm as during the latter part of the summer. Towards the end of the monsoon season in Septomber during breaks in the tains, there is a slight increase in the day temperature. The night temporatures, however, rapidly decrease after Syptember. After the end of October the day temperatures also decrease rapidly. January is generally the coldest month with the average daily maximum temperature at 23.3°C. and the mean daily minimum at 8.9° C. In the cold season, in association with passing western disturbances, cold waves affect the district and the minimum temperature occasionally drops down to about a degree or so above the freezing point of water.

The highest meximum temperature recorded at Lucknow was 48.3°C. on June 1901 and the lowest minimum temperature was 1.1°C. on January 3, 1946, whereas the highest maximum temperature recorded at Amausi was 47.7°C. on June 9, 1966 and the lowest minimum was -1.0°C. on January 31, 1964.

Humidity

During the monseen season relative humidity is generally high, exceeding 75 per cont. Thereafter humidity goes on decreasing. The drivest part of the year is the summer season, when in the afternoons relative humidity is less than 30 per cent.

Gloudiness

During the monsoon souson the skies are mostly heavily clouded or overeast. Cloudiness decreases rapidly in October and in the rest of the year until late summer when mainly clear or lightly clouded skies generally provail. However, in association with passing western disturbances, cloudy skies prevail for spells of a day or two during cold season. From late summer, cloudiness increases, specially in the afternoons.

Winds

Winds are generally light. During the period from May to September, winds blow mainly from the east or south-west. Winds are light and variable in direction during the post-monsoon and cold seasons. In March and April winds are mostly from the west or north-west.

Special Weather Phenomena

In association with some depressions which move across the central parts of the country during the south-west monsoon season, widespread heavy rains and gusty winds occur. In the cold season western disturbances affect the weather over the district, causing occasionally a few thunder-storms sometimes associated with hail. Rain during the monsoon season is often associated with thunder. Dust-storms and thunder-storms occur during summer. Fog occurs occasionally in the cold season. A statement regarding the special weather phenomena month-wise and annual for the district is given in Table IV.

CHAPTER III

PEOPLE

POPULATION

According to the censuses of 1961 and 1971 the area of the district was 2,508 sq. km. and 2,528 sq. km. and the population was 13,38,882 and 16,17,846, respectively. The district occupied 52nd positions in regard to area in 1961 and 53rd in 1971 and in ragard to population it was 25th both in 1961 and 1971.

DENSITY OF POPULATION

At the census of 1961, the density of population in the district was 534 persons per sq. km., which was higher than the State average of 250 persons per sq. km. The most densely populated tahsil was Lucknow, the donsity being 952 persons per sq. km. Next was Malihabad having a density of 288 persons per sq. km. and the last was Mohanlalganj with a density of 271 persons per sq. km. The rural density was 285 persons per sq. km. and the urban 4,682 persons per sq. km. The highest rural density was 302 persons per sq. km. in tahsil Lucknow and the highest urban also in the same tahsil, i.e., 4841 persons per sq. km.

MEDICAL FACILITIES

There were 75 allopathic institutions in district Lucknow in 1977, which had a total of 3,599 beds. The district is second to Kanpur in the number of beds in the State. There were 20 hospitals, 45 dispensaries, etc., and 10 primary health centres. The six non-government institutions which are located at Lucknow had 1,606 beds which made 44 6 per cent of the total number of beds in the district. Of these the Gandhi Memorial and Associated Hospital, Lucknow and the Vivekanand Poly-clinic, Lucknow accounted for 1,371 and 100 beds respectively. Vivekanand Poly-clinic was established in the year 1975-76. The medical facilities have been spread all over the district by the establishment of 10 primary health centres, during the Five-year Plans.

Administrative set-up

In July, 1973, the departments of medical and public health were reorganised abolishing the posts of the civil surgeon and the district medical officer of health. Under the new sot-up, a chief medical officer has been appointed, who heads the entire medical, public health and family planning set-ups in the district. The district has been divided into three zones, each of which is under one deputy chief medical officer, who looks after all hospitals, employees state insurance scheme, dispensaries, infectious diseases hospitals and school health dispensaries and primary health centres under his zone.

In the year 1977-78, the community health scheme was introduced in the rural areas of the district. One health visitor has been posted for each 1,000 of the population. The visitors are trained to render first-aid and preliminary medical treatment and they are also provided with a modical kit, containing medicines bandages, etc. The visitors also report about the incidence of opidemics, if any, to the respective primary health centres.

SANITATION AND PUBLIC HEALTH

The chief medical officer exercises control and supervision over all the health programmes, primary health centres, rural dispensaries, etc. Besides, he is also responsible for the collection of intelligence about epidemics, checking of food and drug adulteration and also for providing necessary assistance during the outbreak of an epidemic. For his assistance there are three deputy chief medical officers, an assistant medical officer at the district headquarters and one or two medical officers in each primary health centre. A team of para-medical officials also work under the medical officers.

For public health and sanitation work every local body has its own team of sanitary inspectors and vaccinators. Each Gaon Sabha is responsible for village sanitation. The services of the sanitary inspectors of the health department are available to the Gaon Sabhas for technical help and guidance. The *Pradhans* (vilage headment) also report outbreaks of epidemics to the respective primary health centres.

FAMILY PLANNING AND CHILD WELFARE

The chief medical officer also exercises complete supervision over the maternity and child welfare, family planning and nutrition programmes. He is assisted by three deputy chief medical officers and a team of medical officers, extension educators, midwives and health visitors.

The famiy planning measures were introduced in the second half of the fifties in the district. The family planning movement is being made popular and the concept of a small family has been spread through documentary films, placards, posters, radio and television.

There are 10 family welfare centres attached to each of the ton primary health centres. Each family welfare centre has three subcentres under it.

MALARIA

The eradication of malaria was initiated in the district in 1960, when the national malaria eradication programme was launched. The programme had three phases; spraying of D.D.T. over the whole district for dostroying mosquitoes, etc., maintenance phase and the surveillance phase. The later oprations involved detection of malaria cases by collecting blood smears and spraying of D. D. T. in areas where malarias is in vogue. Persons suffering from malaria are given radical treatment.

The malaria eradication programme is under the chief medical officer who was assisted by a district malaria officer, two assistant malaria officers, one malaria inspector, one senior laboratory technician and 6 others at the district level in 1980. The staff posted in the primary health contres was—20 health inspectors, 8 health workers and one laboratory technician.

ERADICATION OF SMALLPOX

The national smallpox eradication scheme is in vague in the district since 1962. Before 1973 the assistant superintendent of vaccinations posted at the district headquarters and assisted by a 5 Gl. (R) 11

team of sanitary inspectors and vaccinators was responsible for the control of smallpox. He worked under the supervision of the district medical officer of health.

At present the chief medical officer is in charge of the scheme and he is assisted by three deputy chief medical officers and a team of doctors, sanitary inspectors and vaccinators. The municipal corporation, Lucknow had a medical officer who is assisted by a team of sanitary inspectors and vaccinators. There is one vaccinator posted in each of the other local bodies.

In the sixties, particularly in 1963 and 1965 smallpox was in an epidemic form. In the two years 1963 and 1965 the disease claimed 242 lives and 469 lives respectively. The maximum mortality 53 was reported in each of the years 1969 and 1973.

Besides the Acts of labour welfare mentioned in the last gazetteer (1959) as enforced in the district till 1956, the Children (Pledging of Labour) Act, 1933, the Employers Liability Act, 1938, the Employment of Children Act, 1938, the Factories Act, 1948, the Indian Boilers Act, 1923, the Payment of Wages Act, 1936, the Plantation Labour Act, 1951, the Trade Unions Act, 1926, the Weekly Holidays Act, 1942, the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, the U. P. Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, and the U. P. Sugar and Power Alcohol Industries Labour Welfare and Development Fund Act, 1950, were also enforced.

PROHIBITION

The government launched the prohibition scheme in the State in 1978. Under this scheme many districts of the State were declared 'dry'. In this district prohibition was imposed on April 1, 1978. By a government notification dated March 30, 1978 the sale of liquor and other intoxicants was completely banned in the district. Later the government by notification of September 14, 1978 also prohibited the sale of 19 medicines containing alcohol. The excise commissioner and his subordinate officials looked after the implementation of government notifications. The maximum penalty for the violation of prohibition was a fine of Rs 5,000 and 3 years' imprisonment and the minimum was a fine of Rs 500 and six months' imprisonment.

The government revised its policy regarding prohibition and it was lifted in most of the districts. Though the district ceased to be 'dry' since September 1, 1980, the efforts of the social workers bave continued to make the people conscious of the evils attached with the use of liquor and other intoxicants. A temperance society is functioning in the district. It consists of officials and non-officials and it works through publicity, persuasion and social contact. The temperance activities include the focussing of public attention on the evil effects of drinking and indulging in other intoxicants through the medium of documentary films shows, exhibitions of posters and placards, cinema slides, folk songs, *nautankis*, puppet shows etc.
